Bishop Lawi Imathiu Secondary School (BLISS) is a day public school that serves the poorest families in the community that cannot afford the predominant boarding school system in Kenya. Current enrollment exceeds 700. BLISS is considered a high performing school, based on student performance on their National Exam. Scholarships for current secondary students were provided for over 100 disadvantaged, young people to overcome economic barriers to completing secondary school.

TOTAL SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS: \$15,902

SECONDARY SCHOOL PROGRAM SUPPORT

The equipping of the multi-purpose building, BLISS Hall, with seating to provide large gathering space (up to 1,000) to host whole-school events, student dining during rainy seasons, interschool events and competitions, teacher-parent meetings, music practices and performances, and community gatherings was finished (\$8,586).

Due to COVID, it was compulsory in 2021 and 2022 for schools to incorporate an additional term. Shortened from 14 to 10 weeks, terms still had to cover the same syllabus. To effectively cover the required curriculum, BLISS lengthened daily classes to 6pm, and added Saturday and Sunday afternoon classes. Grant provided for supplemental BLISS teachers and staff support (\$5,959).

Grant provided to the Music Program to enable the BLISS Band to perform at the National Independence Day celebration on December 12, 2022

Provide morning porridge for over 650 students at Gichunge Primary and Kithoka Primary Schools each school day. Grants to the Feeding Programs at Kithoka Primary and Gichunge Primary Schools were essential in the battle to fight malnutrition which was made worse by the severe drought Kenya experienced in 2022.

Grant to Gichunge Primary School for school garden planting in October 2022 for harvest in 2023.

Grant to BLISS (secondary school) for supplemental food material for School Lunch Program (over 700 students) due to school garden crop failure due to school garden crop failure.

The program currently supports over 750 female students at 5 schools in Kithoka, a small village in Meru, Kenya. TOTAL GRANTS: \$6,949
